SUMMER CAMP STAFF OPPORTUNITIES

Please use this guide to determine which camps offer which positions:

CBT (Camp Birch Trails), SAC (Camp Sacajawea), NAW (Nawakwa), DOC (Del O'Claire), NES (Nesbit), ISH (Ishnala), CUE (Cuesta) WIN (Winnecomac).

*Note that Camp Nesbit positions are volunteer positions.

Adventure and Athletic Director: Responsible for preparing and leading campers in all sport and adventure programs. Help to maintain equipment, and ensure safety standards are met. Oversees other adventure staff members.

CBT, WIN, NAW, NES

Art Director: Responsible for preparing and leading campers in all art and craft activities. Help to maintain equipment, and ensure safety standards are met.

CBT, NAW, NES, WIN

Assistant Camp Director: Oversee camp in the director's absence. Assist in trainings, manage money, and assist in supervising staff.

CBT, NAW, NES

Assistant Cook: Assist the Head Cook in planning, preparing, and cleaning up of meals and snacks. Overseeing the kitchen in the Head Cook's absence. Help to maintain equipment and ensure safety standards are met.

CBT, NAW, NES

Boating Director: Develops and carries out all boating activities. Maintains equipment and ensures that safety standards are met.

CBT, NAW, NES

Counselor: Participates, supervises, and directs a patrol in general camp activities, unit activities, and kapers. Develops and strengthens the interests, respect, and differences among campers. Teaches activities and skills to campers.

CBT, NAW, ISH, CUE, DOC, NES, SAC, WIN

Head Cook: Plans, prepares, and cleans for meals and snacks. Oversees all kitchen staff and volunteers. Order food and maintain inventories, records, and other paperwork. Makes sure that all safety and health standards are met.

CBT, NAW, NES

Health Director: Give care in cases of illness and accidents. Keep track of supplies, records, and appropriate paperwork. Ensure that health and safety standards are being met.

CBT, NAW, NES, WIN

Lifeguard: Has taken Lifeguard training and holds a current Lifeguarding Certification.

SAC, ISH, CUE

Maintenance Manager: Perform routine maintenance tasks. Complete necessary repairs. Assist in mowing and weed eating the grounds.

Nature Director: Responsible for preparing and leading campers in all nature activities. Help to maintain equipment, and ensure safety standards are met.

Program Director: Responsible for preparing and leading campers in programs and activities. Help to maintain equipment, and ensure safety standards are met.

Teen Leadership Director: Manage and deliver the CIT 1 and 2 programs. Supervise Teen Staff members.
NES

Trip Director: Ensures all trips follow health and safety standards. Completes records, and inventories. Supervises Trip Leaders.

Trip Leader: Trains, prepares, and leads campers on trips. Assumes responsibility for health and safety of campers. Maintains equipment.

Waterfront Director: Supervises waterfront staff. Ensures health and safety standards are met. Keeps appropriate records and paperwork. Develops and supervises all waterfront activities.

Camp Birch Trails - Irma, WI (Resident)

Camp Birch Trails (CBT) is located just north of Merrill, WI, with 360 acres of private land surrounding the beautiful Olivotti Lake. The lake offers a sandy beach for swimming and great opportunities to learn boating, kayaking, canoeing and much more. Sessions run from June 20 through August 6.

Camp Cuesta - Door County, WI (Day)

Nestled on 57 acres featuring both woodland and prairie, Camp Cuesta is located in one of the most popular vacation destinations in Wisconsin. The rustic and relaxing camp features beautiful trails and wildlife, and it is only a few short miles from Lake Michigan's beautiful shores. Sessions run June 25-26.

Camp Del O'Claire - Weston, WI (Day)

Camp Del O'Claire is a 40-acre wooded area bordered on the south side of the Eau Claire River main tributary. Girls will be able to enjoy arts & crafts, explore nature, and make new friends while working with positive role models. Sessions run July 18 through August 13, 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Camp Ishnala - Crivitz, WI (Day)

Located on 250 acres of prime Wisconsin woodland, Camp Ishnala features beautiful open fields, nature trails, and Memory Lake. Summer program participants can take the group challenge course or enjoy canoeing and paddle-boating on the lake. Sessions run 4 weekends, July 9 through August 8.

Camp Nawakwa - Cornell, WI (Resident)

Camp Nawakwa is a 209-acre camp located northwest of Cornell, WI. Girls will appreciate various aspects of nature by walking along the hiking trails, examining a frog pond and seeing Mt. Baldy (a glacial kame). There are also several outdoor program areas including an amphitheater, waterfront, a large playing field and a low ropes course to allow for a great camp experience. Sessions run June 27 through August 6.

Camp Nesbit - Sidnaw, MI (Resident)

Nestled in the Ottawa National Forest of Michigan's Upper Peninsula, Camp Nesbit offers a scenic, serene setting complete with archery and shooting ranges, a ball field, abundant wildlife, and a private crystal clear lake. At the camp program, "Summer Thing," girls can participate in a variety of activities, which may include archery, swimming, canoeing, kayaking, games, crafts, nature hikes and floating meals on the lake. Sessions run July 11 through July 23.

Camp Sacajawea - Wisconsin Rapids, WI (Day)

Situated on 60 acres of forest, with little Lake Tapawingo for fishing, pond explorations and canoeing, Camp Sacajawea welcomes girls of all ages to build courage, confidence and character during our fantastic summer program sessions. Our trained, caring staff goes out of their way to ensure your daughter has a safe, memorable and enriching experience at Camp Sacajawea. Sessions run June 20 – July 23.

Camp Winnecomac - Kaukauna, WI (Day)

Camp Winnecomac provides girls with a wide array of opportunities to develop self-reliance, confidence and leadership skills. Girls have a chance to learn positive values such as caring, honesty, respect and responsibility, while working in collaboration with peers and positive adult role models. Girls build lifelong skills at camp while making new friends and special memories. 'Adventure' is a day camp trademark!

At Camp Winnecomac, sessions run June 20 through August 20, from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m., Monday - Friday.
