Back by popular demand...

We continue to receive many questions about bridging and have decided to run this one more time!

Tips for ALL Leaders: *Bridging*

Bridging is a Girl Scout ceremony to recognize a girl's progression from one grade level to the next. Each level of Girl Scouting has special bridging activities (outlined in the grade-level Girl Scout handbooks) to help make girls' transitions to the next level meaningful. Bridging activities are part of a Girl Scout's last year at a particular grade level. Each girl is encouraged to work on recognitions for the grade level she is moving into, attend a meeting or activity with a troop or group at the next grade level, participate in a service project and summer activity with girls from the next level, and talk with girls or leaders who are already at that level.

Your Frequently Asked Questions about Bridging:

Q: When should I start bridging my 1st, 3rd, 5th, 8th, 10th or 12th graders to the next level?

A: You should start activities to bridge early in the year - January or February - ideally completed by April or May for the Bridging Ceremony.

Q: How do I get in touch with a leader of a Brownie, Junior, Cadette, or Senior troop in my area to complete the required activities?

A: Contact your Service Area Manager or Membership Manager. She/he will have a list of troops and can connect you to a leader at your school or within the Service Area.

Q: How long do I have to bridge my girls?

A: Until October 1, which starts the new membership year.

Q: Do I have to bridge my girls?

A: No, it is not a requirement to bridge your girls; however, it is an important stepping stone for girls to understand what the next level of Girl Scouting means. Girls must complete all of the necessary requirements in order to earn the bridge.

Q: How do I hold a Bridging Ceremony?

A: You can find ceremony ideas [here](#). Some Service Areas hold Bridging Ceremonies for their entire Service Area. You would need to find out if your Service Area does this annually and get in touch with whomever is planning it in order to take part in the planning process as part of the requirements.

Spring Registration 2010

It's almost time to re-register for Girl Scouts! This spring at Service Area Leader Meetings, you can pick up a packet of everything you need to Spring Register for the 2010-2011 troop year!

We want you to start the year off right! Check out these extra opportunities for your troop when you Spring Register:

- All troops who spring register will be able to purchase spring registration patches from Council Shops at the discounted cost of \$.75. The patch will only be available for girls who register before July 12, 2010. After July 12, 2010 the patch will no longer be available.
- All troops who register 2 adult volunteers and 50% or more of the girls in their troop will receive a special "Summer Fun" troop activity kit to keep! This adorable kit is filled with ingredients for a snack, props for activities, and directions for a fun, no-hassle summer troop event at a park or a beach.
- All troops who register 2 adult volunteers and 75% or more of the girls in their troop will receive the "Summer Fun" activity kit AND a coupon for one girl to attend a Fall 2010 Council Program at no cost (when 5 or more girls attend at full price ~ limit one coupon per troop).

Year-End Checklist

Troop Leaders: Follow these hints to end the 2009-2010 troop year successfully!

- Survey girls and adults to find out if they're returning next year
- Complete Spring Registration forms. Send forms and dues to any Service Center by July 12. Or bring your completed forms in to any Service Center on one of the Spring Registration Days (May 18, May 25, June 1 and June 8 from 1:00 to 6:00 p.m.!).
- Balance the troop account and complete the Annual Troop/Group Financial Report by June 30
- Help your girls complete year-end evaluations online and fill out the volunteer one for yourself. The information you provide on these surveys is critical for GSNWGL's funding and guides the future for our Council!
- Use the 2010 Summer Fun camp guide to get your girls excited about GSNWGL's summer camp sessions
- Plan final awards ceremony. Order all necessary insignia for your final awards ceremony
- Recognize the individuals, businesses and organizations who helped the troop during the year. Send them a note or nominate them for a Community Participation Award
- If you began volunteering before May 1, 2008 and you have not yet completed a GSNWGL volunteer application and background check, please complete this process. To access these forms, using our convenient, 1-step Internet portal, visit: <https://vapp.gsnwgl.org>. If you do not have Internet access, have questions regarding this process, or are unsure whether you have already completed a recent check, please contact your Membership Manager or the Adult Development Department.
- Notify your Membership Manager about the adults in leadership positions – Are they returning?
- Plan summer fun activities for the troop
- Set a date for first formal meeting after summer vacation
- If the troop is disbanding, fill out the Disbanded/Merged Troop Form

If troop has bridging members:

- Make plans to earn the bridging recognition for your grade level
- Plan a bridging ceremony with the girls
- If bridging to a new troop, notify families of their new troop, give Girl Record Forms to new leaders and transfer appropriate amount to new checking account
- Gear up for the new grade level you will be working with
 - Read the Grade Level Resource Packet for the level the girls will be bridging to
 - Attend a face-to-face grade level enrichment training session
 - Watch for new online grade level enrichment options, coming this summer
 - Request a coach to help you understand the ins and outs of your new level

- Be prepared to answer specific questions regarding community service projects completed during the 2009-2010 Membership Year (Sept. 2009-present).

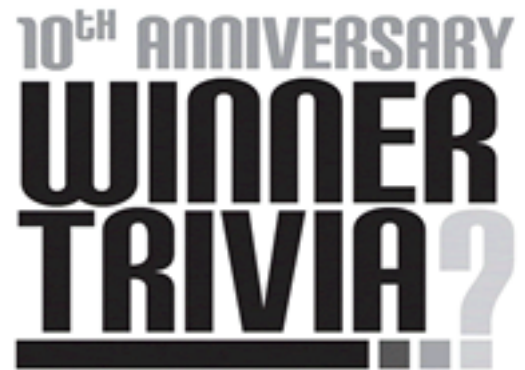
